2004 IOWA CONFERENCE VOLLEYBALL PREVIEW

CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA... Defending Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (IIAC) Tournament Champion Wartburg College received three of eight first-place votes and accumulated 58 points to narrowly edge Simpson College atop the 2004 IIAC Volleyball Coaches' Poll. Simpson also received three first-place votes but fell one point behind the Knights with 57 points. Central College, who has won or shared the last eight Conference titles, received the other two first-place votes, a total of 56 points, and is third in the preseason poll. All nine IIAC teams will see their first action of the year by Saturday, September 4. Conference-play begins with three matches on September 7 and concludes with the nine-team Conference Tournament on November 5-6, at the University of Dubuque.
