#### 2004 IOWA CONFERENCE WOMEN'S SOCCER PREVIEW

**CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA...** Three-time defending Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (IIAC) Champion Loras College received seven of eight first-place votes and accumulated 63 points to claim to the top spot in the 2004 IIAC Women's Soccer Coaches' Poll. Luther College received the other first-place vote and is second in the preseason poll with 56 points followed by Simpson College (47 points), Wartburg College (44 points) and Cornell College (39 points). The complete 2004 IIAC Women's Soccer Coaches' Poll follows.

Conference-favorite Loras is T-24th in the national preseason rankings released on August 24, by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). The Duhawks are tied with Salem State (Mass.) College.

The 2004 women's soccer season begins on September 1, with eight games scheduled that day. All nine IIAC teams will see their first action of the year by Saturday, September 4. Conference-play begins with the Cornell/Buena Vista match on September 18, and concludes with the six-team Conference Tournament on November 2 and 5-6. The first round matches will be played at the higher seed. The semifinals and finals are at Buena Vista University.
